**PREFACE**

The Report on Human Development Index (HDI) 2016 stated that Indonesia continues to progress and now ranks 113 out of 188 countries. Nevertheless, Indonesia still has to face many challenges to demonstrate its success in development distribution and the improvement of people's welfare. In an effort to achieve the SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals) as the successor to the MDGs (Millennium Development Goals), Indonesia needs to work harder. Many challenges such as reducing poverty, providing wider opportunities for women workers to contribute more, drinking water supplies for urban and rural areas, as well as eradicating malnutrition on children can be achieved better with SDGs. It is a comprehensive global agenda that should be in harmony with national and regional development agendas, and Indonesia has committed to act quickly and to start the implementation of SDGs from the beginning.

In the National Medium-Term Development Plan 2015-2019 (RPJMN), one of the national development agenda item focuses on encouraging the development of innovation in an effort to improve public services and competitiveness. Innovative practices conducted by regional governments, private institutions and other parties will significantly contribute to the achievement of the SDGs. Through innovations, larger opportunities will be opened for partnerships and approaches as well as new ideas, practices, technologies, etc., to achieve the 17 goals of SDGs.

Building partnerships is inevitable for SDGs' achievements by involving active participations from all stakeholders to achieve the entire goals nationwide. Among all stakeholders that have been actively involved in developing the SDGs are local governments from all over the world. Hence the inclusion of Goal 11 provides attention to urban settlements and the transformative power of urbanization for development, recognizing the role of city leaders in driving global change from the bottom up. But it is not just about Goal 11, as the achievements of all SDGs require local actions. For many sub-national governments most of the goals, such as those focusing on solutions for land and marine ecosystems, sustainable infrastructure, renewable energy, etc., are equally important.

Underlining both the importance of innovative practices as a source of inspiration that could encourage the creation of wider good practices, and the importance of local leaders as policy makers and leading the implementation of SDGs at the local level, a national event will be organized to link both. Titled “INDONESIA INNOVATION FORUM & EXPO 2017”, it will be held on July 19-21, 2017, with the theme “Local Governance Collaboration to Achieve SDGs”. Through this event, all parties with concerns on local implementation of SDGs and innovation practices to catalyze them, are able to share ideas and experiences. This would potentially boost the synergy that leads to multi-sectors, multi-stakeholders and cross regional collaboration and partnerships to achieve development goals.
